Learning Labs are supported by the Kentucky Department of Education's Principal Partnership Project (P3) and Assistant Principal Partnership Project (AP3).

For the past two years, P3 has championed professional opportunities to use schools as learning labs for principals to network and grow professionally together. Principals who have attended Learning Labs found great value in the sessions as they enjoyed having honest conversations around timely topics they selected, were able to receive just-in-time support and engage in relevant classroom observational experiences together.

Historically, principals have wanted resources and to conduct conversations about the following topics:

- Novice Reduction
- Gap Closure
- Meeting the Needs of all Students
- Effectiveness of School/Teacher Groups
- Student Centered Culture

However, the beauty of the day is that principals who attend actually direct the conversations of the day.
